*Ferndown Youth Centre, Wednesdays from 11.15 - 12.30 p.m.*

Looking at pictures, sculpture and beautiful buildings is a joy that is increased when shared with others. This is an opportunity to share this enjoyment and knowledge of art in all its forms.

#### **ART WORKSHOP**

*(Anne Dyer and Jill Francis) Ferndown Youth Centre, Thursdays from 9.30 - 10.45 a.m.*

Come and join us to paint in a friendly environment and gain encouragement and advice from others. No tuition.

#### **ARTS AND CRAFTS (June Buxton)**

*Ferndown Youth Centre, Tuesdays from 2.30 - 4.30 p.m.*

The craft items we will be making are simple, inexpensive, stylish and decorative. We hope to have some fun and a social afternoon. Trips to craft centres may be arranged if members wish. We will start by making pressed flower pictures (I will bring the flowers and cards) - you will need PVA or Copydex glue and scissors.

#### **ASTRONOMY (Graeme Nash) Starts 23rd September**

*Ferndown Youth Centre, Mondays from 2 - 4 p.m.*

This one-year course deals with all aspects of astronomy. Topics considered include: some basics of the earth's place in the universe, the history of astronomy to 1900, instruments and observing techniques, the solar system, the sun, the stars, galaxies and cosmology, including the origin of the universe. Weather permitting, observations of the sun (using safe filters) and Venus are made. The presentation is informal with use made of view graphs, slides, models and astronomical equipment. No previous knowledge of astronomy is assumed. Active participation by course members is encouraged and extra topics suggested by them are warmly welcomed.

#### **BEGINNERS' CHESS (Daphne Brown)**

Course members can then work on the investigation either on their own or with others. Each session will end with a discussion of the results. The course will not be rigid and members may suggest investigations or problems for the rest of the group to solve. The objective is that the sessions should be thought provoking, but more importantly FUN!

**MAP AND COMPASS** (*Richard Buxton*)

*Ferndown Youth Centre Portacabin, Tuesdays 11.15 - 1.00 p.m.*

Here is an opportunity to learn how to read a map and practice your skills with others. The speed at which the course progresses will depend on the group. However the intention is to start at the very beginning, no prior knowledge required. It won't be all theory, about half the time the group will be going outside, relating the map to what they see around them. We will be walking, but at a slower pace than normal, the distance depends on the activity, but around one or two miles is to be expected. The course will be based on the OS Outdoor Leisure map 22 (New Forest) 1:25,000 scale. If you haven't got a copy, don't go out and buy one, or a compass for that matter.

**MUSIC APPRECIATION WORKSHOP** (*Joan Waugh*)

*Ferndown Youth Centre, Thursdays 2.00 - 4.00 p.m.*

If you like Classic FM you will enjoy the opportunity to learn more about composers and to listen to their music. We will investigate everyone's likes and dislikes, from Schubert to Strauss and Souza to Scott Joplin, from Kiri Te Kanawa to the Three Tenors, from Madame Butterfly to Swan Lake. We will all grow in our musical tastes and we will plan trips to concerts, opera and ballet, as well as musicals and perhaps even the Proms!

**ON THE SHAKESPEARE TRAIL** (*Audrey Confrey*)

*Ferndown Youth Centre, Wednesdays 11.15 - 12.30 p.m.*

A leisurely journey through the text of Henry IV, Part One, pausing to admire the scenery of Shakespeare's poetic imagery and deep knowledge of human nature. This will be a group interactive study, the leader will be hoping to explore the thoughts, feelings and knowledge of members. We may even get to the end of the play and on to Part Two. Bring along your own copy or copies of the play, hopefully one that contains line numbers. The Wordsworth Classics edition is available from Borders at £1.

**PASSPORT TO THE LAND OF WINE** (*Gerry Lewis*)

*Ferndown Youth Centre, Thursdays 11.15 - 12.30 p.m.*

This course is specifically tailored to meet the needs of members who wish to obtain a comprehensive framework of information and guidance about the wines of the world. This all-consuming subject will be presented in an interesting and easy way, particularly for the beginner. We should all take the opportunity to sample the wide variety of good quality wines so readily available to us, both at home and on our holidays.

**PHILOSOPHY WORKSHOP** (*Terry Baker*)

*Ferndown Youth Centre, Mondays 3.00 - 4.15 p.m.*

We are a small group of people interested in contributing to discussions on philosophical matters. There is a short introductory talk lasting perhaps 20 minutes or so, and then the group as a whole considers and discusses that topic in some detail. No point of view is barred, but consideration and respect for others is a requirement.

**PLAY READING** (*Jo de Havilland*)

Each session will finish with discussion of the chosen play, and perhaps the course will lead to a performance at the end-of-term party.

**POETRY FOR PLEASURE** (*Pat Davies*)

*Ferndown Youth Centre, Tuesdays 3.00 - 4.15 p.m.*

Not opened a poetry book since schooldays? Don't know a quintain from a quatrain or a nonet from a sonnet? Don't worry - this class aims to provide enjoyment in reading many differing types of verse. Members bring along poems they find interesting and, in this way, we meet old favourites, and make new discoveries. At least once a term we take a



closer look at one specific poet. There is no compulsion to produce your own poems but these are always welcomed.

**SCRABBLE** (*Sue Lancy*)

*Verwood St Michael's, Thursdays 1.30 - 3.30 p.m., fortnightly starting 26<sup>th</sup> September*  
All abilities are welcome.

**SCRABBLE AND BOARD GAMES** (*Beatrice Barr*)

*Ferndown Youth Centre Portacabin, Tuesdays 1.30 - 3.30 p.m.*

It will be mainly scrabble with the introduction of Rummikubs, Triominos, etc. Please bring games you wish to play to each session.

**SPACE EXPLORATION 1957 - 2002** (*Brian Ford*)

*Ferndown Youth Centre, Wednesdays 3.00 - 4.15 p.m.*

The tutor of this new course has been interested in astronomy and space flight since 1954 and he would like to share his interest in this fascinating subject. The course is an overview of unmanned and human space flight from Sputnik 1 to the International Space Station. No previous knowledge of astronomy or other sciences is necessary. The course will be a mixture of lectures, visual presentations and hopefully discussions. It will appeal to those who have curiosity and interest in all aspects of space exploration.

**UNDERSTANDING SCIENCE** (*Sheila Goode*)

*West Moors Youth Centre, Wednesdays at 11.15 - 12.30 p.m.*

This is a course for those who feel they missed out on science and would like to look at the basic principles but link those ideas to modern developments which are transforming our lives. Some simple experiments and no maths.

**WRITERS' CIRCLE** (*George Lorimer*)

*Ferndown Youth Centre, Thursdays 9.30 - 10.45 a.m.*

No formal lessons are given. An essay subject is set each week, although most members of the group prefer to choose their own subject. It is not expected that everyone will produce work each week but the essays submitted are read aloud (by their writers) and criticised sympathetically (by the remainder of the group). A certain amount of stimulating discussion, on writing and kindred subjects, takes place each week. Although some members have had work published, others prefer to write purely for enjoyment.

**YOUR MONEY IN RETIREMENT** (*Robert Browning*)

*West Moors Youth Centre, Wednesdays 9.30 - 10.45 a.m., from 18th September*

*Ferndown Youth Centre, Wednesdays 11.15 - 12.30 p.m., from 8th January*

This is a 7 week course. It examines the various investment opportunities available and their relevance to your particular needs. We normally have the services of 2 guest speakers - a solicitor who gives an entertaining talk on Inheritance Tax, and a stockmarket guru, who was a former class student. Subjects include: investment income, how to use your assets to their maximum potential, how to invest wisely in the stockmarket, personal tax, and many others. It is important to realise that the maximum benefit is obtained by attending all lectures where possible. Summary notes will be provided at a charge of £2 for photocopying.

Basic Acol/Standard English bidding explained. Plenty of time for paying set hands to illustrate the explanations. Learn to enjoy the game in a friendly environment.

#### **SECOND YEAR BRIDGE (Tim Lines)**

*Ferndown Youth Centre, Wednesdays 1.30 - 3.30 p.m.*

Bridge that gap between beginner and 'improver'. Second Year Bridge should help you to consolidate what you already know, learn a few new tricks, and deal confidently with the main problems that arise in bidding and play.

#### **THIRD YEAR BRIDGE (Bill Orme)**

*Ferndown Youth Centre, Mondays 1.30 - 4.15 p.m.*

Now you can play this wonderful game and wish to develop your skills, come along and play with others of a similar standard in a relaxed atmosphere - because BRIDGE CAN BE FUN!

#### **CAMERA WORKSHOP (Ann Williams and Richard Buxton) Fortnightly starting 19<sup>th</sup> September**

*Ferndown Youth Centre, Thursdays 1.30 - 2.45 p.m.*

This course is a series of workshops to improve your photography. Each month there will be a new theme to our activities, with some theory and lots of practice. You can discuss your trials and tribulations. Photography need not be expensive, come and find out how in a friendly supportive atmosphere.

#### **CHRISTMAS SUGARCRAFT (Rita Steel) 1 term**

*West Moors Youth Centre, Wednesdays 2 - 4 p.m.*

A flexible class suitable for beginners. Marzipan, ice and decorate your Christmas cake to your own design - plenty of ideas and help given. Fun with marzipan modelling and flowers and foliage in petal paste.

#### **COMPUTING - (Sheila Goode)**

*Ferndown Middle School, Thursdays 5 - 6 p.m.*

A hands on computer course which will be held in the computer room at Ferndown Middle School. We shall use Microsoft Word, Excel, Powerpoint and Publisher and the Internet, learn to create folders in which to save your documents and learn how to make a database of names and addresses which we could use to mail merge and address envelopes. The software used is compatible with Microsoft Works. Wherever you are on the learning curve this course should enable you to advance and learn new techniques. There is a charge of £20 per term for the course because we have to pay the school for the use of the facilities. 15 places are available each Autumn and Spring term.

#### **CRAFT (VARIED) - (Elma Champion and Jay Smith)**

*Ferndown Youth Centre, Tuesdays 11.15 - 1 p.m.*

This course offers members an opportunity to learn new skills.

#### **CREATIVE WRITING (Barbara Bateman)**

*Ferndown King George V Pavilion, Thursdays 9.30 - 11.15 a.m.*

This group is for people who like to express their feelings and emotions through prose or poetry, or try their hand at creating characters, situations and stories. Members give one another lots of encouragement and help. Most writing is for our own pleasure and beginners are most welcome.

#### **SATURDAY SINGLES SOCIAL GROUP (*Pat O'Riordan*)**

Primarily this is a group of members who, because they live alone, meet for a pub lunch the second Saturday in each month. In addition, arrangements are made to attend the theatre, ballet, cinema, etc. on an ad hoc basis.
