Everyone joining the U3A <u>must</u> fill in the registration form to join Ferndown U3A. If you want to apply for bridge you must <u>also</u> fill in the form for bridge. Please use a separate bridge form for each person. Applications received by the 14th August will be dealt with as if they arrived on the same day. Applications received after 14th August will be dealt with at the end of the week in which they arrive.

All classes are expected to use Basic Acol / Standard English, Foundation Version. (Weak N.T., weak take outs, Stayman & Blackwood).

Class Descriptions

BEGINNERS' BRIDGE - Structured Class (John Turnbull)

Verwood St Michael's Parish Rooms Thursdays 1.30 - 3.30

We will start at the beginning so no knowledge of the game is expected. We will learn a simple bidding system and the emphasis will be on enjoyment as opposed to serious competition. By the end of the very first lesson, you will have played a form of bridge!

BEGINNERS' BRIDGE (PART 2) - Structured Class (Derrick Williamson)

One of the best ways to improve your bridge is to bid and play prepared hands. Each prepared hand will contain a full explanation of what to bid and why. This programme can be used in many ways; to learn new concepts improve your all round bidding and play, or simply to have fun on the way to reaching your personal goal.

IMPROVERS' BRIDGE - Structured Class (Tim Lines)

ASPECTS OF TUDOR ENGLAND (Valerie Falconer)

Verwood St Michael's Parish Rooms, Thursdays 1.30 - 3.00

The end of the Middle Ages and dynastic civil wars makes the Tudors worthy champions for the development of the national identity of England. David Starkey says "Henry VIII is the pivotal king of English history" and Elizabeth I saw the colourful flowering of English culture and commerce. The course will consider the nation state, and the relationship with Europe.

BASIC FAMILY HISTORY (Lesley Wilson)

We will look at the background to his life, his boyhood, his career as Duke of Gloucester and his short reign as King of England. SHAKESPEARE'S RICHARD THE THIRD (Babs Creamer)
Ferndown Youth Centre, Wednesdays 11.00 - 12.15, Term 1 (see also History)
After a brief look at Richard's introduction in Henry VI, Parts 2 and 3, the course will proceed with a study of the play itself. Please bring along any copy of the play you have. Towards the end of the course there will be a showing of Lawrence Olivier's Richard III at my home.

MUSIC

MUSIC APPRECIATION WORKSHOP (Joan Waugh) Ferndown Youth Centre, Thursdays 1.45 – 3.45

If you like Classic FM you will enjoy the opportunity to learn more about composers and their music and grow in your musical taste. We are a friendly group who enjoy listening to a varied selection of music mainly classical. We regularly visit Bournemouth Favilion Theatre for operas, ballets and galas sharing cars for transport.

TECHNICAL TOPICS

ASPECTS OF SPACE EXPLORATION (Brian Ford) Ferndown Youth Centre, Wednesdays 9.30 – 10.45

This course is a combination of previous Years 1 & 2. It may appeal to members who have attended Years 1 & 2 and to others interested in the subject. On offer will be the topics cov-

ered in previous years. At the start of the course members may choose a selection from the lecture list.

ASTRONOMY (Graeme Nash)

Ferndown Youth Centre, Mondays 2.00 - 4.00

This one-year course deals with all aspects of astronomy. Topics considered include some basics of the earth's place in the universe, the history of astronomy to 1900, instruments and observing techniques, the solar system, the sun, the stars, galaxies and cosmology, including the origin of the universe. Weather permitting, observations of the sun (using safe filters) and Venus are made. The presentation is informal with use made of view graphs, slides, models and astronomical equipment. No previous knowledge of astronomy is assumed. Active participation by course members is encouraged and extra topics suggested by them are warmly welcomed.

ASTRONOMY/SPACE EXPLORATION CLUB (Gina Pointing) (Starting 6th October) Ferndown Youth Centre, Thursdays 11.15 - 12.30 - Monthly 1st Thursday

A chance to meet others who share the same interest with a view to exchanging information and trying to keep up-to-date with space launches, discoveries, etc., in a friendly and informal atmosphere. It may be possible to have an occasional speaker, also Graeme Nash and Brian Ford will try and attend once a term to answer questions. Field meetings for observing the night sky and a few excursions are also possibilities.

DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY (Chris Powell)

Ferndown Youth Centre, Mondays 2.00 - 3.30, Term 1

This course is aimed at people who have recently acquired or are thinking of acquiring a digital camera. Much of the course will concentrate on the differences between digital and conventional photography and we will explore the following major areas.

Different types of digital cameras and how they work; lenses, viewfinders, batteries; camera handling, focusing, depth of field, flash, zoom (optical and digital), dial modes and panoramas; scanners, viewing, storage and slide shows; different ways of printing, printer types, printing services, paper types; and basic editing of digital images.

GEOMORPHOLOGY (Dr Ken Coombe)

Ferndown Youth Centre, Wednesdays 9.30 - 10.45

The course consists of a series of illustrated lectures covering basic wave dynamics, beach response (morphology), sea level movements, sea defences, coastal (mis)management, cliff geology and form, esturine and fluvial implications on coasts, basic rock types and resulting landforms. Field trips to Lulworth Cove, Osmington, Chesil Beach, Portland etc., as well as Poole area.

MAP AND COMPASS (Richard Buxton)

Indoors at Ferndown Youth Centre, Thursdays 9.30-10.45 (1st week at FYC 9.30)

or outdoors all morning, meet at 9.15 a.m. in Ringwood

Learn how to read a map and use a compass - no prior knowledge required. It won't be all theory; when it's fine the group will be going outside, relating the map to what they see around them and walking around three miles. The course will be based on the OS Outdoor Leisure map 22 (New Forest) 1:25,000 scale. If you haven't got a copy, don't go out and buy one, or a compass for that matter.

UNDERSTANDING SCIENCE (Sheila Goode)

Ferndown Youth Centre, Thursday 1.30 - 2.45

This is a course for those who feel they missed out on science and would like to look at the basic principles and link those ideas to the modern developments which are transforming our lives. Some simple demonstrations, experiments and no maths. Probably visits instead of talks in summer term.

WRITERS

CREATIVE WRITING (Barbara Bateman)

Ferndown Youth Centre, Thursdays 9.30 - 11.15.

This group is for people who like to express their feelings through prose or poetry, or try their hand at creating characters, situations or stories. Members give each other lots of encouragement and help. Most writing is for our own pleasure and beginners are most welcome.

CREATIVE WRITING CIRCLE (Colin Gregory) (Starting 6/10/05)

At homes in Verwood Thursdays 9.30 - 11.00, fortnightly 1st and 3st weeks
Come and develop and improve the skills of Creative Writing by exercise, practice and discussion, in a supportive atmosphere, structured to encourage writers of all levels of experience.

WRITERS' CIRCLE (Chris O'Donoghue)

Ferndown Youth Centre, Thursdays 9.30 - 11.00.

No formal lessons are given - a subject is chosen each week, but members may choose their own subject. Whilst not everyone will have a piece of work every week, those submitted are read aloud, stimulating discussion on writing and kindred subjects. Some have had work published, whilst others prefer to write purely for enjoyment.

MISCELLANEOUS

CURRENT AFFAIRS (Jackie Burns)

Ferndown Youth Centre, Thursdays 11.30 - 12.45

Members enjoy a full and free discussion of important topics chosen by the group.

DISCUSSION GROUP (Betty Wraw)

(Starting 12/9/05)

Verwood St Michael's Parish Rooms. Mondays 1.30 – 2.45, fortnightly (1st and 3st)
An informal group where members will be able to share their opinions about current affairs, ethics, moral leadership and local issues. Topics to be chosen by the group.

DRAMA WORKSHOP (Colin Culham)

Ferndown Youth Centre, Tuesdays 11.15 - 12.45

This group deals almost entirely with improvisation – that is, unscripted drama. The members will be given unlimited scope to explore ideas, character, feelings, and to make full use of the imagination through the playing of drama games and the creation of improvised situations. This type of work will help to eliminate shyness, self-consciousness, diffidence, and help towards a fluency of communication. A drama workshop can be serious or lighthearted, depending on the mood of the moment. It should always be creative and enjoyable.

INVESTMENTS (Edward Whitingdale)

At home in Ferndown, Tuesdays 2,30 - 4,00

Although unit trusts etc. are important they are not always sensible to our needs as pensioners. We, as an alternative, consider such companies as Sainsburys, Marks and Spencer, and the rest of the market, in some detail and in addition ways to invest to enhance our pensions while at the same time minimizing risk.

PASSPORT TO THE LAND OF WINE (Gerry Lewis)

Ferndown Youth Centre, Thursdays 1.30 - 2.45

This course allows members to obtain a comprehensive framework of information and guidance about the wines of the world. This all-consuming subject will be presented in an interesting and easy way, particularly for the beginner. We should all take the opportunity to sample the wide variety of good quality wines so readily available to us, both at home and on our holidays.

PHILOSOPHY WORKSHOP (Terry Baker)

Ferndown Youth Centre, Mondays 2.00 - 3.30

We are a group interested in discussing philosophical matters and active participation is encouraged. We look at the ideas of major philosophers from Aristotle to Wittgenstein with the course centred round the book *Philosophy, the Classics*, by Nigel Warburton, (Routledge £9.99)

SPIRITUALITY (Judith Henderson)
Ferndown Youth Centre, Wednesdays 9.30 – 10.45
Informal discussion on faith in the 21st century.
