It is your responsibility to exclude yourself from any photographs when they are taken if you do not wish to be included in this way.

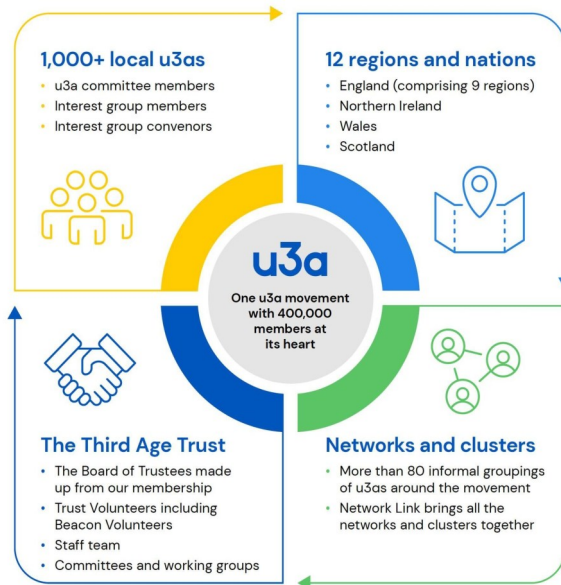
ACCESSIBILITY
